Responding to Jesus at Christmas

From Proverbs 8

What does a "wise" response to Jesus look like? In Proverbs 8, we see one way the wise will respond to Jesus.

"THE WISE WILL SEEK JESUS DILIGENTLY"

Proverbs 8:17 says, "those who seek me diligently find me." The word diligently means, seeking with intentionality...it is a kind of seeking that goes out of our usual way, that breaks with our normal routine and pursues with great determination and tenacity.

This is the kind of seeking that characterized the wisemen in Matthew 2: 1-2. "Behold wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

If you lost a child in the mall, how diligently would you seek for them? If you lost your dog while taking her for a walk, how diligently would you seek for her? If you lost your wedding ring while cleaning the house, how diligently would you seek for it?

A wise response to Jesus is seeking him diligently...like the wisemen diligently seeking to find the king of the Jews, like a parent diligently seeking to find their lost child, like an owner diligently seeking to find their lost pet, like a spouse diligently seeking to find their wedding ring!


This Christmas season is a great time for us to step back and evaluate our priorities. To ask the question," What am I pursuing with great determination and tenacity? What am I seeking with a focused intentionality?

Wisdom understands that Jesus Christ is the one and only true necessity in our lives. Wisdom realizes that I need to grab hold of Jesus with all my strength while holding everything else loosely. Because wisdom believes that whoever has Jesus has life and whoever does not have Jesus does not have life (I John 5:12).

So above all else, more than listening to Christmas music, more than watching Hallmark Christmas movies (pssst... they're all the same), more than making sure that we bought the perfect gift, let us make sure that we are going out of our way to listen to Jesus in His word, to talk to Jesus in prayer, to serve Jesus as we share His love with those around us!

GRATEFUL HEARTS

Gratitude is one of the most difficult concepts to teach toddlers and preschoolers -- who are by nature self-centered -- but one of the most important. It is critical to teach children the meaning of gratitude from a young age. Those who are raised knowing how to feel and express a sense of gratitude grow up to be well-rounded individuals, with a greater level of self-efficacy and interpersonal skills. Sure, thankful children are more polite and pleasant to be around, but there's more to it than that. By learning gratitude, they become sensitive to the feelings of others, developing empathy and other life skills along the way. Grateful kids look outside their one-person world and understand that their parents and other people do things for them -- prepare dinner, drive them to soccer practice, give hugs, buy toys. On the flip side, kids who aren't taught to be grateful end up feeling entitled and perpetually disappointed.


It can be hard for children to understand why they can't have everything they want in the store. Money is a relatively abstract concept and if they've never paid for something, they may not understand why you're saying "no." Next time your child really wants a new toy, encourage them to think of a way to earn the money and buy it themselves. This could be through saving up their allowance, doing extra chores at home or for other family members.

Resist the urge to shower them with too much "stuff." Of course, we to want to give our kids the best, and this isn't to suggest that we refuse to buy them anything but the bare essentials. But buying children whatever they want, whenever they want, weakens the gratitude impulse and it can mean that they don't learn to value or respect their possessions. They wind up having too much stuff, they don't appreciate each toy or game, as they keep setting their sights on the latest and greatest. One of our family's traditions before Christmas when our children were young was to have them go through all their toys and donate anything that was gently used and no longer played with. This encouraged grateful hearts and helped them think of others.

Have a moment of thanks each day when everyone shares something they're thankful for. Whether the list includes a favorite toy, a particularly good day at school, or our warm beds, this daily tradition can help develop a positive frame of mind. Older kids might even prefer to keep a gratitude journal and write down a few things they were thankful for each day before going to bed.

Lead by example: How many times per day do you say, "thank you"? Tell your children what you are thankful for. Our children are watching our every move. We can't ask them to be grateful if we are not. Come home and talk about the happy parts of your day, making a conscious choice not to complain. Keep in mind that teaching gratitude to children takes time, patience, and—yes—a grateful heart in YOU. It's an ongoing process and it certainly won't happen overnight. You'll need to continue modeling and practicing thankfulness and appreciation throughout your child's development.

You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God. 2 Corinthians 9:11

"If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples.


Then you will know the truth and the truth will set you free."



Lost and Found



We will meet in the sanctuary at 10:15 am for an interactive Christmas worship experience that will include the opening of a few interesting gifts, reading passages from Scripture that take us through the Christmas story and all interspersed with the singing of quite a few Christmas carols! At the conclusion of our time in the sanctuary we will all move to the fellowship hall for our potluck lunch. As our time in the sanctuary will be full of fun and interaction for the whole family, there will be no Children's Church or Nursery that week.

We are excited and looking forward to this time of family fellowship and respite from the busyness of the season to refocus on the mystery of God's love for us expressed through Christ's incredible humility and sacrifice.



Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study

The Saturday Morning Men's Prayer Breakfast, which meets on the first and third Saturdays will meet this month on December 7th and December 21st. The in-depth study and discussion of the **Book of Acts** (chapter by chapter, verse by verse, word by word) will continue with comprehensive studies of **Chapter 17** and **Chapter 18** and Paul's Second Missionary Journey.

At the conclusion of **Acts Chapter 16**, Paul and Silas were in Philippi in Macedonia, a Roman colony, where they were beaten and jailed for exorcising demons from a slave girl who made money for her owners by telling fortunes.

We discussed how during the night, their chains were miraculously removed and how they witnessed to the jailers who were converted to the Lord, they and their households.

When the magistrates sent to have them set free, Paul insisted that apologies be personally given by them for the harsh punishment that they had received (both being Roman citizens). So the magistrates came "and apologized to them. And they took them out and asked them to leave the city" (Acts 16:39).



In Chapter 17, we will discuss Paul and Silas' journey to Thessalonica, "where there was a synagogue of the Jews" (17:1). There they faced opposition and went on to Berea where Jews from Thessalonica followed, "agitating and stirring up the crowds" (17:13). As a result, the brothers at the church in Berea sailed with Paul as far as Athens in Achaia (Greece), while Silas and Timothy remained in Berea.

The discussion will then turn to Athens where Paul "reasoned in the synagogue with the Jews and the devout persons and in the marketplace every day with those who happened to be there" (17:17). While preaching at the Areopagus (Mars Hill), Paul informed about "the unknown God" whom the Athenians worshipped.

Chapter 18 records the spreading of the Gospel further throughout Achaia. First to be considered is Paul's visit to Corinth (about 65 mi. from Athens) where he met Aquila and his wife, Priscilla, who were fellow tentmakers commanded by Emperor Claudius to leave Rome. After being rejected by the Jews who "opposed and reviled" him, Paul "shook out his garments and said to them, 'Your blood be on your own heads! I am innocent. From now on I will go to the Gentiles'." (18:6).

The discussion will then center upon the account of when the Jews made a united attack on Paul and brought charges against him before the tribunal (the Bema – Judgment Seat) and why the proconsul refused to hear their complaint. He stayed in Corinth a year and a half.

After that, attention will be brought to Paul and his return to Syria, by way of Ephesus and Caesarea. After spending some time there, he embarked on his **Third Missionary Journey** which will be discussed in **Chapter 19**.

The study of **Chapter 18** will conclude with the introduction of a Jew named Apollos who preached the Gospel in Ephesus, assisted by Priscilla and Aquila. He then went to Achaia where "he greatly helped those who through grace had believed" and "powerfully refuted the Jews in public that the Christ was Jesus." (18:27,28)

The Men's Prayer Breakfast and Bible Study is an outstanding opportunity for Bible study, prayer, and fellowship. And now that the weather is turning colder, perhaps the "honey do" obligations are lessening. Why not use that "extra" time on Saturday morning eating a good breakfast and Bible Study. There are worse ways to occupy your time. It's a great way to meet others. It is open to all men, church members and non-members. All are invited to enjoy a good breakfast of scrambled eggs, sausage, biscuits, grits, sausage gravy, fruit, juice, and coffee. Come and enjoy good fellowship, and the Good News found in God's Word. Plan to attend and bring a friend. It's a good and enjoyable way to spend a couple of hours twice a month. Breakfast begins at 8:00 AM and is followed by Bible Study and prayer. It concludes no later than 10:00 AM.

It has been an exciting year in Junior Children's Church as we have prayerfully sought to follow God's leading. We have seen God work through His provision of lovely ladies and gentlemen who have volunteered to teach and train our 4-year olds through kindergartners.
